Racine Catholic Food Pantry

Thank you all very much for your continued donations to the Racine Catholic Food Pantry. The November and recent JP II Stuff-The-Bus contributions were particularly generous, saving the pantry time and money which would have been spent to buy what you brought. Thanks, again! Along with the frequently depleted supplies that we use every month, we can also use dish and clothes detergent, hand soap, toilet paper, canned meats (not Tuna), baked beans, jelly, pancake mix, syrup, saltines and graham crackers. On the Road to Lent

What makes life a flop? There is a great sadness about a life, a Catholic life in particular, that went to Mass every Sunday, as important as that is, but Mass on Sunday, period, only that, and then watches TV for 5-6 hours a day, gambles at the casinos at every opportunity, knows all the sports statistics upside down and inside out, deals cards, plays golf or a host of other diversions, but comes away totally ignorant of Jesus Christ and His Church. The first question in the catechism is still the key question: Why did God make me? And the answer: He made me to know Him, love Him and serve Him in this life and to be happy with Him forever in the next. Sometimes families and children become the only occupation at a point in life and yet that worthy occupation is made especially rich when there is a search together for a closer relationship with Jesus Christ and a deeper understanding of his Church. The word of God in Deuteronomy sets it out clearly: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today. Drill them into your children. Speak of them at home and abroad, whether you are busy or at rest" (Deut 6:4-7). Jesus observed, I would like to say complained, that the people of this world are more shrewd about the mundane things that occupy them than the people of the next who have all kinds of spiritual riches at their disposal.... words to that effect (Luke 16:8). Lent is a time to take stock, to examine our relationship with Jesus Christ and our commitment to his people, the Church. Do we know Jesus Christ on a personal level? Prayer is conversation with Christ on a regular basis. Do we have a good hold on what the Church really teaches from her two-thousand year tradition of interpreting the Bible whose canon she determined? A dear friend of mine once said: "Time to get out of those barcas!"
