**Dear Parishioners,**

I have to laugh when people say to me that the summer must be nice with the reduced activity in and around church. This summer has been particularly busy with all kinds of things, not the least are three major development activities: the Archdiocesan strategic planning project, "Vision 21", the Archdiocesan first-ever capital campaign: "Faith in Our Future" and, of course, the wrap-up of our own three-year capital appeal "Faith Needs Room to Grow." All of them require meetings and the need for volunteers. We will be looking for volunteers to cover the many aspects of the Archdiocesan capital appeal. It has three starting phases and we are in the last. We will begin early in 2009. Like our own, it is a three-year commitment but with a 60/40 split between parish and diocese. As such, although not envisioned when we began our capital appeal, it will be a handy follow-up to our own appeal and complementary to it. We hope many of you will consider "signing on" again, and that it will be a first time for those who have not participated in our parish appeal. The diocese will soon be officially handing to the parishes the aspects of the strategic plan that pertain to them. Our deanery has an *ad hoc* committee in place preparatory to the formation of the mandated Blue Ribbon committee to implement the parish and district aspects of the diocesan plan. The Archdiocese has asked us for twenty-five years to look to a drastic reduction in the number of priests. We cannot be too aware of the need to be ready for the future. The recent demographic study sponsored locally for the Racine and Kenosha districts is most helpful. Finally, there is the wrap-up of our parish capital appeal "Faith Needs Room to Grow." I cannot thank you enough for your generosity and your faithfulness to your personal goal in that regard. As I mentioned in the recent quarterly letter, the Building Committee will reconvene in the near future so we can proceed.
