TRUSTEE ELECTION - SECRETARY

Sacred Heart Parish, Racine, was incorporated according to the laws of the State of Wisconsin on October 31, 1916. The officers of the corporation are the Most Reverend Archbishop of Milwaukee, the Vicar General of the Archdiocese, the Pastor, and two lay trustees.

At this time parishioners are invited to nominate candidates for the office of Parish Secretary to the Corporation. Please note carefully the nomination procedure. Nominations may be made in writing and signed by at least ten practicing communicants of the congregation for each nominee. All nominations shall be made at least two weeks before the election and shall be announced two weeks prior to the election.

Only such persons who are practicing communicants of the congregation and have attained the age of twenty-five years shall be eligible to nominate and vote. The Secretary to the Corporation shall keep or cause to be kept a current register of the names and addresses of each parishioner; make arrangements for the Board of Directors meetings; direct preparation of the agenda; keep the minutes and attend to corporate correspondence. Trustees are members of the Parish Council, *ex officio*. The term of office is two years. Nominations are to be made by June 10, 2008. Election will take place in June. Please submit nominations to the Parish Office.
