Dear Parishioners,

The end of this month brings the 40th anniversary of Pope Paul VI's last encyclical letter, *Humanae Vitae*. That's the "birth control" encyclical and people are still sounding off in their anger. They have never read it, of course. If they did they would know two things right off the bat, it was very pastoral and it wasn't only about birth control. It is a highly prophetic document that foresaw much of the mess we are in today. It was Pope John XXIII who established a commission to review the life issues faced by society. Indeed one of the incentives for that was the "pill" that came out of France in the outset of the 1960's. Pope Paul VI received the reports from the Commission, both a majority and a minority report. Paul's critics ignore the fact of two reports and accuse him of not listening to the "report" that gave some sanction to artificial contraception. Pope Paul deliberated and prayed and placed his decision with the minority report, making it the majority report. His friend Cardinal Suenens of Belgium chastised Pope Paul for not consulting the bishops before he wrote his encyclical. Pope Paul had consulted widely, but stung by the attitude of some bishops and the backlash by many priests, he never wrote another encyclical using the vehicle of the "Apostolic Exhortation" instead. And he did that very effectively, his documents on Marian Devotion and Evangelization were outstanding. *Humanae Vitae* has gone down as a landmark statement. It has held credibility and continues to emerge with greater luminosity as time goes by. Most of the in-house negativity was created by inept pastoral practice by priests and sheer indifference on the part of bishops. Yes, some not all. We can't ignore the role of frisky theologians who felt they had replaced the Church's Magisterium. Yes, some, not all. The rest was from the hostility of "the world" which, with no surprise, will oppose what the Church teaches.
