Abridged Minutes
Sacred Heart Parish Council Meeting
Minutes of June 28th, 2011 at 7 p.m.

TRUSTEES REPORT:

- Don Trottier reported that the water main funds were considered deferred income and not recognized as revenue. Approximately \$11,000 has been donated so far. The election for a new trustee will take place after Mass July 9th and 10th.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- Michelle reported that the Haban Hall dedication was well received. A review of the Strategic Plan/ Vibrant Parish for the year was discussed. The Parish Ministry and committees were congratulated on the past year and challenged to implement continuing programs for the parish. Richard reported that during the last Admin Meeting Al reported that St. John will finish \$24,693 short of their budgeted amount. Don will address this with Jan Ruidl. The Admin Committee supports the pursuit of the School Choice Program for JP II. The go ahead was given for the water main repair to begin as soon as possible.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Haban Hall was dedicated on June 18th beginning with Holy Mass at 4:30 by the Archbishop. A luncheon was served after the dedication.
- The Hospitality Weekend Schedule was approved for mailing. 2011 Agenda Committee will be named in July. It was suggested that the Parish Council host the one in September. Larry and Michelle will coordinate the dates with Al. Pat McCray will replace Judy Chiappetta.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Don led the discussion on School Choice. The council approved the recommendation of the principal to begin the procedure to enroll students for the next school year. JP II can accommodate 25 students effectively. The next new member parish registration will be after Masses on August 27th and 28th. The new Parish Council members will "shadow" the current designated members: 4:30 pm Terry and Matt; 8: am Dick and Paul Noelke; 10:00 am Veronica and Paul Schumacher.
- **Committee Officers and Liaisons for next year are:** Larry Wilson, Chairman; Veronica Cabiro, Vice Chairperson; Paul Noelke, Secretary. Admin Liaison, Richard Blackwell; CYF/ Adult Formation Liaison, Matt Winkler; School Liaison, Paul Schumacher; Building and Grounds Liaison, Pat McCray; Human Concerns Liaison Veronica Cabiro; Prayer and Worship Liaison, Terry Smith.
- **Pastoral Comments:** Father Crewe advised the council of a letter from the parish attorney advising the church of a pending encroachment legality taking place. A previous parish council instituted the action.

An additional thank you was extended to all the council members for their continued support during the past year, a thank you to the members leaving the council and an introduction of the new members joining the council.
