## A Very Good Year

Recently I stumbled into two four hundred year anniversaries; the founding of Santa Fe, New Mexico, in 1610 was the first. I happened to be in Santa Fe in September for a five-day seminar sponsored by the Marquette Haggerty Museum of Art. Santa Fe was founded out of Mexico City which in 1610 was already nearly 90 years old and sending out explorers, *conquistadores* and missionaries. The University of Santo Domingo and the cathedral in the Dominican Republic, then Hispaniola, were well in place by 1510. Last weekend the Racine Symphony Orchestra and the Southeastern Wisconsin Choral Arts Society commemorated the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Claudio Monteverdi's Vespers of 1610. Conductor Pasquale Laurino gave us a helpful introduction to that important composition which marks the birth of the baroque era in music. Pasquale Laurino, an outstanding violinist, was a soloist at my 25<sup>th</sup> jubilee Mass over twenty years ago. 1610 was a very good year.

## HUMAN CONCERNS

### *Racine Catholic Food Pantry*

Once more, MANY thanks are in order for all the grocery donations to our Catholic Food Pantry that make life more bearable for those in financial straits in our community. This is evidenced by the 661 individuals (191 referrals) who benefited from our provisions during September. Though our pantry is a bit low in supplies, lately, we are still able to buy what is needed to fill the bags we hand out; money donations make this possible. Despite our present good fortune at remaining well stocked in groceries, what we can use are able people to serve as regular (2 hrs once per month) volunteers, or substitute (occasional relief for the regulars) volunteers. If you think you can volunteer for one of these positions, even for a limited period of time, do call Gail at 634-5096. We also continue to have use for plastic and paper grocery bags.

### *Outreach Project*

The October Outreach Project is Health Care Network, Inc. which will receive a \$125.00 grant. Health Care network, Inc. provides free or low cost health care to residents of Racine County who have no insurance, are of limited income and ineligible for government assisted programs. Founded in 1987, there are over 350 physicians, dentist, and other medical care providers that offer thousands of appointments each year.
