**Dear Parishioners,**

One of our brilliant parishioners – and we have many – recently shared a quotation that spoke to her: “When you are suffering, you are a spiritual powerhouse.” In a letter to her friend Mary Mercer Warren, Abigail Adams writing about George Washington quoted poet Edward Young: “Affliction is the good man’s shining time.” Washington, we tend to forget, prevailed by strategic retreat rather than won battles, at least until it mattered. The majority of the country was against him and the cause. The Continental Congress stiffed him on funding. A second cousin of mine whom I visited in Belgium on two occasions was afflicted with polio as a child. Her father was stricken at the same time but he died. Agnes spent over forty years on her back in bed until her death. She gave me the beautiful French adage: “La cloche qui chanté e passé par le feu” – “the bell that sings has passed through the fire.” One of the treasures you and I have in our Catholic faith is a highly developed theology of suffering based on the Sacred Scriptures. “Offer it up” is the Catholic answer to whatever suffering comes our way. It is the year of St. Paul. A few of his pearls on the subject are: “When I am weak, I am strong” and “I consider the sufferings of this present life to be nothing compared with the magnificent future God has in store for us.” Don’t let it go to waste.

**NORTHSIDE FOOD PANTRY**

Once again, we're asking for nonperishable food and personal care supplies. The need for additional food never ends, and, at present, needs may exceed supplies. Beside privately donated and government foods that stock the RNSCFP shelves, the Pantry also receives individual pizza donations from Pizza Hut, and frozen soups, sauces, and main dishes from Olive Garden. We still run short at times. In constant need are beef stew, other canned meats, canned fruit, spaghetti, potatoes; baked beans, chili, saltines, graham crackers, jelly, macaroni and cheese, rice mixes, hamburger helper, boxed potatoes, fruit juice, tomato juice, bar and dish soap, toilet tissue, toothpaste and brushes. Bags of food and other supplies can be placed on the empty table in the Ushers' Room. As an option, checks made out to St. Vincent DePaul (memo: Food Pantry) dropped in the Collection Basket, Poor Box, or at the Parish Office, or cash, in a marked envelope, will be happily accepted. Thank you in advance for whatever you can provide. Pantry statistics for April: # of people - 623; # of referrals 201. May: # of people -726; # of referrals-237.
