The Pope in Westminster Abbey: the Perfect Blend

Westminster Abbey in London was founded by St. Edward the Confessor in the 11th century and dedicated to St. Peter. The great church there today was built later but all of it was Catholic for centuries. On his recent visit to the U.K. Pope Benedict gave one of his most important addresses with great courage and deep humility. He spoke about Christian unity. He said that unity among Christians requires “an obedience which must be free of intellectual conformism or facile accommodation to the spirit of the age.” That took courage. The Church of England has been in the forefront of accommodation beginning in 1930, the first to break from the birth control teaching held by all Christian churches, sects and denominations up to that time. That Accommodation has picked up pace ever since especially in recent decades. Pope Benedict’s manner throughout his visit was gentle, genial and genuinely humble. He is well aware of his responsibility to adhere to the Gospel “in season and out of season” and he does it with the perfect blend of courage and humility.
