**Dear Parishioners,**

As we take note of the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pope Paul VI's encyclical *Humanae Vitae* we might review his prophetic warnings: (1) widespread use of contraception would "lead to conjugal infidelity and the general lowering of morality." (2) the man who grew accustomed to the use of contraception would ultimately lose "respect for the woman, no longer caring for her physical and psychological equilibrium" would come to consider her an "instrument...and no longer his respected and beloved companion." (3) the widespread acceptance of contraception would place a "dangerous weapon...in the hands of those public authorities who take no heed of moral exigencies." (4) the most subtle and the key to Pope Paul's teaching is that the common use of contraception would lead men and women to think that they had "limitless dominion over their own bodies and function." A chain of causality was set in place which successively abrogated the rights of the unborn, the rights of infants, the rights of children, the rights of young adults the rights of women and the rights of men. The shame of American society, abortion, lies under the surface of an unthinkable chain of crimes: partial birth abortion, infanticide, child abuse, banishment of youth, battering of women and degradation of men. We have experienced the plague of AIDS and sexual abuse in the life of the Church and the ignorance surrounding them. The vocation crisis in the Church, in my view, is without doubt traceable to that shortfall of generosity which contracepts the "rhythm accident" or, even worse, aborts it, eliminating the unexpected child of blessing who will later become a priest or sister. Frankly, I think it is time to canonize as a "white" martyr and saint the great prophet-pope Paul VI to bring attention to the consistent teaching of the Church he defended and witnessed so courageously.
